sisters. If you need leaflets, please contact me.


We need more folks to volunteer a few hours a week to do candidate literature drops and phone calls to union households. Please volunteer for a few hours. Our futures depend on it.

Krizan is a member of Teamsters Local 340 and Williams is a member of USW Local 1211. Pa. AFL-CIO Secretary-Treasurer Frank Snyder also spoke.

Access to the LAN will take you directly to their targeted phone bank, the LAN is available for phone banking from 9AM until 9PM. You can use your login and make calls whenever you have the time during the LAN calling hours. You only need to go through the training one time, but it is offered multiple times each week.




